EWYL is Twice the Fun!

Our main goal this year was to duplicate the curriculum for our new Zanesville center. Over 300 lessons and 100 DVDs were reproduced. Our dedicated staff and volunteers achieved this goal by working after center hours and on days off. Heartbeats of Muskingum Valley was able to offer the EWYL Program to their clients when they opened their doors September of 2013. Their Boutique was renovated earlier this year to offer their clients the very best!



Our Practical Fatherhood module helps fathers focus on: Role Models, Respect for Mothers, Being a Leader, Discipline & Being Consistent.

Amanda benefited from Lorraine's Learning Fund, set up in honor of retired supervolunteer Lorraine Allori. Amanda attended the Bridges Program regularly and completed the lessons on Job Training. She received a gift of \$100 which was used for work attire.



Goals for 2014-15

We have purchased the 2013 upgrades for EWYL and 2 new modules on Adoption. We plan to have these lessons available to our clients by fall 2014.

We would like to purchase the Positive Partnerships modules. The cost is \$400.00 and has one module for women and one for men. The lessons cover Healthy Relationships, Cohabitation Dangers, Making the Marriage Choice, Staying Married and Single Parenting.

We are collaborating with Licking Memorial Hospital Smoking Cessation Program. Our goal is for LMH to soon start the intake process at our Newark center.

Surrendering the Secret Facilitators Jannie Wick Angela Cook



An interactive Bible study and video series that leads those hurting from abortion to a path of healing.

- Three women completed the 8 week study
- Age at time of study: 39-64
- Age at time of abortion: 17-33

There were a total of 5 abortions among the participants.

The following statements and numbers are from a pre-group questionnaire:

Who chose to have the abortion?

- 3-"Mom"
- 2- "mutual decision"

Reason for the abortion

- "I was only 17."
- "Just started a new relationship."
- "Got pregnant because I was lonely just trying to give my virginity away. Young, dumb and selfish."
- "In college, selfishness on my part did not want a child then."
- "Financial-husband lost job."

How did you find out about Surrendering the Secret?

- "Was presented to me through Heartbeats"
- "Through my sister who is a team leader in [another state] and then went on the website."
- "Rebecca at Heartbeats."

The following statements are from a post-group evaluation:

What were the major problems you most wanted help with when you "signed up" for the group?

- "Was not aware I was still carrying shame and grief."
- "The question of why & what was the purpose for the group when I felt healed."
- "I didn't think I had a problem when I signed up. But I discovered I had not forgiven myself."

What aspect of the program was most helpful to you?

- "Going before the Lord asking gender and name of children."
- "Having to go back and think-even when all felt resolved."
- "The naming, individualized my child for the 1st time."

Each of the flowers represents a child lost to abortion whose mother chose to honor them at a special memorial service.



What are your overall feelings about the program?

"I feel STS is a very good program. The videos were very enlightening and brought a wealth of different knowledge and perspectives to our group. The testimonies from the video as well as the personal testimonies from the group were wonderful. Knowing I was not alone in my feelings, fears, guilt and finally release was refreshing."

"I thank you for this study. I thank you for the women who are part of this study. Before this study I felt shame and guilt. I no longer feel that shame, God's grace covers all things. I can accept God's love for me and no longer feel guilty."

"I was totally surprised at my ignorance of the beginning and progression of life. These facts smacked me in the face. I had to deal with the truth of my selfish action. I loved the way this program slowly walked me through to the actualization of my "child". Christ's forgiveness and promise that I will see and know her in heaven. Thank you so much for this healing, cleansing journey!"

Two clients were considered "abortion-minded" at their pregnancy test appointment. When they returned for the ultrasound they had made life-affirming changes in their intentions and were changed to "abortion-vulnerable." Both of these clients reported miscarriages for these pregnancies.



What information did you gain from the ultrasound?

- My estimated due date, baby's heartbeat.
- My baby has a face.
- My little baby is almost an inch.
- How much the baby can move at such a small size.
- At 5 weeks gestation, my baby's heart is the size of a poppy seed.
- Educational information about the baby.

What did you like best about the medical services you received?

- What I liked best was the interest of the nurse, she really seemed to care.
- The ultrasound, it was amazing to see the detail.
- Angela was so nice and respectful and answered all my questions and was very patient.
- Compassionate, supportive and informative.
- I love how everyone is just nice and welcoming no matter the circumstances.
- I loved that Ruth spent time with me, listened to my concerns.

Did the ultrasound provided influence your decision regarding this pregnancy?

- Yes, made it more real
- Yes, it made me see that parenting is the best decision.
- Yes. Was not sure if I was ready but seeing the baby encouraged me.
- The ultrasound made me see the realization of my pregnancy and how important to me my baby is.
- Yes, it made up my decision to keep the baby
- Yes, I'm more determined to parent.
- Yes. Makes me happy I chose to birth and parent :)

A couple came in for a pregnancy test and marked that they were undecided about their pregnancy intention. They stated their reason for considering abortion was "strictly financial". They didn't want their current children to suffer from additional financial strain. The nurse shared with them about community resources that could help pay for prenatal care and delivery. The couple returned a week later for an ultrasound with a changed intent to parent!

From someone who indicated she was undecided at time of pregnancy test: "Yes, Was not sure I was ready but seeing the baby move reassured me I was."!







Tiffany McFee RN BSN, Jenna Linton RN and Bethany Spray RN took a trip to Atlanta in the fall for a *fundamentals in limited ultrasound* course. They then returned to Heartbeats for a grueling two-week hands on obstetrical ultrasound training with a sonographer. They all passed the course and are using their skills to scan patients and save lives, Tiffany in Zanesville, Jenna and Bethany in Newark.

Ultrasound Training in Atlanta

"The NIFLA Ultrasound training in Georgia was a wonderful whirlwind of tons of great information and training! Not having any experience in Ultrasound (other than having one when pregnant) it was such a foreign skill set for me. The week of hands on training by our wonderful instructor Patsy that followed helped put all the pieces together for me. Doing scan after scan after scan for so many days in a row really helped solidify the didactic information we acquired in Georgia into real life stuff! Giving women their first look at their baby, talking to them about the size and development of baby, discussing names they have picked out for either gender and seeing the excitement they display when we see the heartbeat is by far the most rewarding thing I've ever experienced as a nurse!" Client Stories

Client "J" had a positive pregnancy test with us at the beginning of the year (2014). She was married, but felt that with her circumstances she couldn't choose to carry this child. She had had a previous abortion that she regretted, but still felt that her only option was abortion. She even drove to the abortion clinic, but didn't go through with the appointment. Still very confused on what to do, "J" went to her first prenatal visit. Several days later she wasn't feeling quite right and went back to the doctor. She had a miscarriage later that same day. She tried to pretend she hadn't lost anything, but she knew she had. "J" wrote to us to thank us for our prayers and support. She says they helped her tremendously.

Client "S" came to us in October after she had taken a home pregnancy test. "S" had had a previous abortion and was also contemplating one for this pregnancy. "S" was not married and her relationship with the baby's dad was not healthy. We gave her a tour of the boutique and all that we offered through our parenting program. We were able to give "S" a vision of life and we gave her the hope and encouragement she needed to give life to her baby. We are thrilled to announce that she gave birth to a healthy baby boy that we have met in person. "S" continues to come in for support and says, "I can't believe how much you care. I don't know where I'd be without you." She also tells us that she shares with others what Heartbeats has done for her and encourages others to come into our parenting program.

"A" came to us after taking several home pregnancy tests. She is in college and has relationship issues with the baby's father. She also does not have a good relationship with her mother. After a positive test with us she responded by saying, "I know my life isn't over; it's just going to change." "A" was thinking about choosing parents for her baby. She later came in for an ultrasound and was still undecided whether she wanted to parent or choose parents. "A's" boyfriend was present at all visits and very supportive. "A" is due late this fall.

Client Stories





"K" is a 27 year old single mom of two who came to the center stating, "I'm 99% sure I will have an abortion." "K" had a previous abortion 7 years ago. She shared that the father of the baby was encouraging her to abort. "K" claimed to have a relationship with God and said she was concerned about God forgiving her. The consultant encouraged "K" to take the week to "pray and listen" for an answer and not make a rushed decision. "K" did not show for two scheduled ultrasound appointments and stopped responding to our attempts to contact her. Taking note of the "babies born" in the paper, we saw that she delivered twins several months later! A followup call to "K" verified that she had delivered the babies, their father is actively involved and "everything has turned out good!"

"H" is an 18 year old who came to Heartbeats for a pregnancy test. She stated that she is undecided because of pressure from her mom to abort. "H"s mom told her that she would have to move out if pregnant. The father of the baby was with her and supportive and excited. The Consultant shared pregnancy options information with the couple and prayed with them. "H" and her boyfriend returned for the ultrasound and said they now planned to parent. When asked what had made their decision, she replied, "abortion is too horrible, I couldn't live with that." "H" even shared that her mom wanted them to stop by and show her a picture of the ultrasound! "H" gave birth to her baby in Summer 2014.

"C" is a 23 year old woman who came to Heartbeats for a pregnancy test. She came in undecided because she was already parenting an 11 month old and wasn't sure she was ready for another baby. "C" said that several of her friends have had abortions and told her it would be "no big deal." "C" watched the FYI Pregnancy video with her Consultant and was surprised to learn that the baby develops earlier than she thought. A follow-up call to "C" a week later revealed that she no longer considered abortion as an option! She delivered her baby in Fall 2013.

Heartbeats' Babies Born!

Training



Thirty-three volunteer Client Consultants were trained this year in the LOVE Approach curriculum. Eight of these were trained during a special August session in Zanesville to launch the September opening of the Zanesville location.

Interns

All four had the opportunity to complete the Client Consultant training and work directly with clients.

One of the Newark Interns organized a "Flower Pot Decorating and Flower Planting" event geared toward young kids.









Historymakers: called to follow in His steps...

For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example, so that you might follow in His steps. 1 Peter 2:21 ESV

In the 45 years since our pregnancy center was founded, many have answered God's call to be the "cross-bearers for the child-bearers". (John Ensor) Some stayed to become Historymakers and to live out Jesus' commandment to love our neighbors as ourselves. God has shown favor to Heartbeats since our center's inception in 1969 because we endeavor to honor and sanctify His creation of human life. We have been blessed with the provision of God's church and the many individuals and families who give to our mission faithfully, and often sacrificially. They provide the resources needed to help, and give hope, to families that come to us in crisis. We are grateful for our friends that steward their money to Heartbeats.

Bottles for Life is the simplest way for individuals and churches to invest in the ministry of Heartbeats. There are families filling bottles with coins, currency and checks nearly every month of the year. 81 total churches, 13 in Muskingum Valley, participated in the 2012-13 BFL campaigns, bringing in \$85,000.

A number of churches, both in Newark and in Muskingum Valley, additionally donated \$57,000 by giving monthly, quarterly, or annually, or by special offerings for Heartbeats.

581 individuals sponsored their friends in last fall's 2-mile Walk for Youth. \$23,000 was given in support of our Relationships Under Construction school programming.

Heartbeats 100 Hole Golf Challenge was held in Zanesville in May bringing in \$14,500.

Honoring a loved one's life and their passing with a financial gift to Heartbeats creates a legacy of life in their memory. In the past fiscal year we received 22 memorial gifts totaling \$13,400.

Friends of Heartbeats requests are sent to many in our database that are unable to attend one of our fall banquets. Friends of Heartbeats giving amounted to \$79,000, and much of that giving is monthly automatic withdrawal.

We celebrated the 1-year anniversary of Heartbeats Muskingum Valley on September 30. That was possible, due in part, to four special days last November. We had a banquet and luncheon on November 5-6 in Zanesville, followed by two banguets on November 7-8 in Newark. Almost 800 guests attended four events. Cash and pledges amounted to \$172,000, the largest proceeds from any banquet season. Most of the pledges are automatically withdrawn monthly.

As we prepare for three banquets this fall, this year's theme, Together For Life, is a natural follow-up to the previous year's theme, Historymakers: called to follow in His steps...To quote Peter H. Davids in his commentary of 1 Peter, "It is God who takes the initiative through His action in Christ and enables the human response of commitment." In summation, we are called to follow in His steps and then we are all together for life.

Relationships Under Construction (RUC) satisfies all eight requirements of Ohio's mandate for abstinence education for middle and high school students. Through the use of medically-accurate information and compelling presentations, students are encouraged, inspired, and equipped to make healthy choices for life. The week-long curriculum provides information and practice in protecting personal dignity, maintaining sexual integrity, and building healthy relationship skills. Even though abstinence education is mandated in Ohio, schools do not receive funding for it. Heartbeats offers this vital programming, including the educators and materials, free of charge to public and private schools, and youth groups. \$2500 funds RUC in a typical school for one grade level.
